## **Our History**

Fremantle Christian College has a long and vibrant history that stretches back to 1903, when Hamilton Hill Primary School was established to ease enrolment pressures at nearby Coogee Primary School. A single classroom from that era remains on site; a landmark heritage-listed structure, recognised by the Cockburn Council.

In 2003, New Life Church, a thriving congregation in Fremantle, was invited to adopt Calvary Christian College, leading to its rebranding as New Life Christian College. In line with the Board's vision for a broader regional impact, the College was renamed Fremantle Christian College (FCC) in 2014.

Today the College delivers Christ-centred, quality education from Pre-Kindy to Year 12. Known for its strong pastoral care, deeply embedded Christian values, consistent and respectful approach to discipline, and close-knit community feel, FCC is a highly sought-after educational choice in the region.
